Conclave on Cancer

As per a very recent report in 2018 there were 7.84 lakh deaths with 12.1 % rise due to cancer and there was 15.7 % increase incidence in six years. Cancer remains a big challenge in India. The actual figures might be more.

Let me share some information. It is stated that 'after global efforts and more than 40 years of work in the fight against cancer, the "magic bullet" has not yet been found. This is perhaps not so surprising considering the complexity of a disease such as cancer.' Further, "The popular understanding of cancer—that if you have even a single cancer cell, it will multiply to the point that it eventually kills you—is fundamentally wrong," says Virginia Moyer, M.D., a professor of paediatrics at the Baylor College of Medicine in Houston and chairwoman of the U.S. Preventive Services Task Force, an independent panel that provides evidence-based guidelines on health care. "What we've learned in the last decade or so is that cancer doesn't always act like that. Lots and lots of cells in our body turn cancerous and then disappear; others look like cancer but do absolutely nothing."2

Immunotherapy is the buzzword but 'Experts in the cancer field generally have now come to recognize that, in order to achieve a meaningful immunotherapeutic effect when treating Cancer, immunotherapy should be used as treatment early in the disease process.' Whereas the limitations of current immunotherapies are stated to be '(immunotherapeutic) products were not always as pure or specific as they initially were thought to be and were generally more toxic when given systemically, especially when given in high doses.1

These are interesting observations where I strongly feel that AYUSH systems have much to offer. The 5 themes categorised for 'Conclave on Cancer' are of significance.

There is newly found emphasis on signs and symptoms in the field of cancer, for early diagnosis, treatment specificity and non-recurrence. The vast knowledge base as available in our ancient texts are required to be explored in the context of biological and system biology knowledge gathered over last few decades. 'Prevention of Cancer, AYUSH Perspectives and Clinical Insights' put jointly together, if researched, studied and documented have huge potential to prevent this disorder which is now considered a group of disease or shall I say a 'dysfunctional chain of biological disturbance' as could be explained in Ayurveda?

Similarly, if immunotherapy is the solution than

February 2019 IASTAM NEWSLETTER traditional products that are used with clinical – therapeutic wisdom to address various signs and symptoms related to different types of cancerous situations could be systematically studied. Drug research approaches beyond conventional approach are needed to find therapeutic solutions. Such an approach will need integrative approaches in true letter and spirit for new discoveries. Sessions on 'Developing Drugs and Products for Cancer Management' and 'Cancer Biology and AYUSH Principles' will help provide new perspectives for research.

Documentation—registry of experiences of individuals physicians and institutions is a long felt need though it is yet to be implemented successfully.

I hope the deliberations at the conclave will help us decide on right next steps.
